Before going on, please allow me to apologize for being unable to participate and report at the Mabon meeting, With Hurricane Irma, my mother entering hospice and me still not cleared from surgery, there was just too much going on at the same time.

Current and Pending Issues & Activity

1. Before Samhain, I will do a drawdown from the PayPal account into the Chase Business Account. I will leave \$1,000 in PayPal.
2. I completed the corporate filing for CA. I added Canu as CEO and myself as CFO/Secretary. Stachia is listed as the Agent of service (thank you). Forms attached. Filing was \$20.

3. I will add Canu as a signatory to the Chase and Wells-Fargo accounts after Samhain.
4. I have not received all reconciliation receipts for MM/GC.
5. We decided that the Synchrony CD be extended to the maximum possible term, at least that is what I recollect. Verifying that is the case, I will contact Synchrony on the issue.
6. Zenah is in receipt, I believe of an updated deposit only Chase card to facilitate her service as Mail Witch. If anyone knows of other such cards out there, please let me know.
7. I will create a savings account in Chase and transfer \$25,000 as the Deborah Ann Light gift so it is secured away from the operating budget.

Other notes:

1. I'm not sure what follow-up we have been able to do with the suggestions from the Leadership Institutes.
2. I suggest that we return to the conflict of interest forms we discussed before. Would the board like for me to draft it for each of our signatures?
3. I would like for us to discuss the purchase of D&O insurance.
4. We will need to renew the license for Adobe Connect. I have already received the bill. It is part of our budget so I will execute after Samhain.
5. We need to address the mechanism for sending the speakers to Florida.
6. Everglades Moon Local Council has requested the \$1,000 loan of working capital for GC/MM 2018. I will execute as Samhain if they need it.

As stated in the Bylaws, Local Councils are free to set admissions policies for their Local Council and Local Assembly of Solitaries, without interference by National, if the local policies do not conflict with the National Bylaws and policies, and the variances are published annually at Samhain in the National newsletter for review by the membership. Such variances apply only to admissions policies. LC policies may be more structured or tailored to local conditions than those outlined in the Bylaws, but they may not be discriminatory. For example, they cannot have a different standard for Solitaries than for Coven members, and they may not discriminate by tradition, race, gender, age, sexual preference, or country of origin. Grand Councils 2002 and 2003 specifically restricted Local Councils from requiring an applicant to perform a ritual for the entire LC membership, and from requiring an applicant to have an initiatory lineage.

Everglade Moon Local Council - Membership Variances

1. A Coven or a Solitary that applies to Everglades Moon Local Council for membership needs two letters of recommendation, one of which must be from a member of this council. Reaffirmation on this variance was twinkled by all.
2. Any person who is a former member of an EMLC member coven, needs to have one of their letters of recommendation be from their former HP or HPS or designated CoG coven contact. Please note this does not apply to a solitary member of a member coven who wishes to hold dual status as a solitary member also. The Local Council Board can waive this requirement on a case by case basis at the Board's discretion. Reaffirmation on this variance was twinkled by all.
3. New applicants must attend 3 EMLC meetings, one of which must be in person, before membership application materials will be forwarded for National publication. After a discussion on whether it was 3 EMLC events or meeting the reaffirmation on this variance was twinkled by all.

Northern California Local Council - Admission Policies Variances

Taken from the NORTHERN CALIFORNIA LOCAL COUNCIL POLICIES Compiled by Anna K. last updated 10/12/2013

1) ADMISSION: Requirements for admission to the Assembly of Solitaries (AOS) are the same as for covens, and are not at variance with the National Bylaws. Come to one or more LC meetings, meet members, answer their questions, and if members raise no doubts or objections, submit a Membership Application, Statement of Practice, and two recommendations via the LC Membership Officer. The Statement of Practice will be read and discussed at a Local Council meeting, and if the application is approved by the LC membership, it will be published in the National COG newsletter. During the Local Council approval discussion and decision, applicants must absent themselves from the room or the meeting.

If the application is approved, the applicant(s) must submit the complete application packet together with national and local tithes, or apply for Grace of the Goddess Funding if unable to afford the tithe payments. This will entitle them to receive the National newsletter, apply for credentials and other member benefits, serve on COG committees, and join the COG and Local Council listserves. After their application is published, and after a 90-day wait without any objections being lodged, membership will be granted. This policy is not different from current standard National practice in the Bylaws.

5) SHIFT FROM COVEN TO AOS MEMBERSHIP: Persons with prior Coven member status who wish to change to the Assembly of Solitaries (their coven hived, moved, dissolved or has no interest in remaining in COG) must submit new applications, statements of practice, and two recommendations. This is an opportunity for an update on the individual's practice and standing in the community. [April 17, 1993] This NCLC policy is in accord with national membership policies stated in the Brigid 1998 National Newsletter by the National Membership Officer, and in the Bylaws, Article 2 Section D.

16) MEMBERSHIP POLICIES: As stated in the Bylaws, Local Councils are free to set admissions policies for their Local Council and Local Assembly of Solitaries, without interference by National, if the local policies do not conflict with the National Bylaws and policies, and the variances are published annually at Samhain in the National newsletter for review by the membership. Such variances apply only to admissions policies.

LC policies may be more structured or tailored to local conditions than those outlined in the Bylaws, but they may not be discriminatory. For example, we cannot have a different standard for Solitaries than for Coven members, and we may not discriminate by tradition, race, gender, age, sexual preference, or country of origin. Grand Councils



2002 and 2003 specifically restricted Local Councils from requiring an applicant to perform a ritual for the entire LC membership, and from requiring an applicant to have an initiatory lineage. We do not feel NCLC policies are at variance with the membership policies or process established on the National level or mandated in the Bylaws.

We conduct all business through consensus decision of the membership, not by executive action of a limited group. The LC Membership Officer's actions consist of bringing new applications to the membership for consideration, and helping the applicants to assemble the paperwork and to negotiate the membership process.

Membership Process (from the National Bylaws, reflecting changes at GC 2007 and 2009)
From Article 2. D.

2. The Membership Officer or the Board of the Local Council shall, after receipt, act on each application for membership in the Covenant. They may accept the application for publication and further processing, or refer the application to the National level, delay or decline to accept the application, or take whatever action on the application they believe to be in the best interests of the Covenant and the Local Council. Should the Membership decline to accept the application, a short note to that effect shall enter the Local Council minutes.
3. After the application has received the final approval of the Local Council Membership, the Local Council Membership Officer shall forward one set of the completed application materials as specified in Article 2, Section C.1., National Application Procedures, to the National Membership Officer. Statements of Practice and Letters of Recommendation for an applicant shall be published in the next issue of the CoG Newsletter, and a 90-day review period for receipt of any possible objections shall begin for the applicant.
4. If any Member has any objection to this application, that Member may communicate such objections to the National Membership Officer who will immediately refer the matter to the Membership Officer of the Local Council. Receipt of an objection will cause the Local Council Membership Officer to refer the application for reconsideration by the Local Council Membership.
5. If, after the termination of the 90-day Review Period following publication as specified in Article 2, Section C.3, National Application Procedures, no objections to the application have been made, the National Membership Officer shall approve the application.
6. A National Solitary or National Coven in good standing wishing to transfer into a Local Council

may do so with approval of that Local Council. Local Council application procedures will be followed. The Local Council Membership Officer must notify the National Membership Officer of the transfer. If the Local Council does not accept the transfer, the Member's status remains at the National level.

PROCEDURES FOR JOINING THE COVENANT OF THE GODDESS THROUGH THE NORTHERN CALIFORNIA LOCAL COUNCIL:

To join Covenant of the Goddess through the Northern California Local Council, the prospective member coven representative(s) or solitary must:

- 1) Come to a local council meeting to introduce the Coven or individual applying.
- 2) Become familiar with the Local Council and allow the Local Council to become familiar with the applicant.
- 3) Present the application to the Local Council, with completed application form, tithes, statement of practice, and two letters of recommendation. Ideally, at least one recommendation should come from a member of our Local Council. This is a preference, rather than a requirement.
- 4) Current annual national tithes are \$110-170 per coven, or \$50-90 per solitary. Local Council annual tithes are \$25 per coven or \$10 per solitary. If the tithes are a hardship, it is possible to arrange for them to be reduced or waived, or to apply for National or Local "Grace of the Goddess" funds. Tithes cover the expenses of CoG projects.
- 5) Await a discussion of your application at subsequent LC meeting(s) until an opinion is formed. The decision on your application must take place at a meeting following the meeting at which you applied, once your paperwork is completed. Admission takes, at a minimum, about 3 meetings. There have been a few applications where discussions went on for several meetings, or applicants were asked further questions. We understand that some meetings will be quite distant for some prospective members and would not ask you be present at all of them. There are rare admissions where application occurred at one meeting and admission at the next, but in practice, this is rare, partly because paperwork takes time to gather. This paragraph is intended to allow prospective applicants to understand that admission (and subsequent credentialing) is not possible in just a few days. We've had many inquiries in which the person wants a credential by next week.
